-<u>Leo Schorje</u> spoke on strategies for building an orchid collection that always has something blooming, with a minimal number of plants. He suggests selecting orchids with long lived flowers and orchids with a frequent bloom habit. He stated Phals. are the most common "ever blooming" capable orchid. He also mentioned that hybrids with yellow back ground often can be in bloom for years at a time.
